<sup>1</sup> To qualify as a reasoned opinion as defined in Protocol No 2, an opinion must state why the national Parliament considers that a legislative proposal does not comply with the principle of subsidiarity and be sent to the Commission within eight weeks of the transmission of the legislative proposal to national Parliaments.

<sup>2</sup> Under Protocol No 2, each national Parliament has two votes; in the case of a bicameral system, each chamber has one vote. Where reasoned opinions represent at least a third (for proposals under Article 76 TFEU a quarter) of all votes allocated to the national Parliaments, the yellow card threshold is reached and the draft legislative act must be reviewed. 19 out of 56 votes represent a third of all votes allocated.

<sup>3</sup> Of which one came jointly from the two chambers of the Spanish *Congreso de los Diputados* and the *Senado*.
